This book examines 21st-century South African autobiographical writing that addresses the nation's socio-political realities, both past and present. The texts in focus represent and depict a South Africa caught in the midst of contradictory and competing images of the 'Rainbow Nation'. Touching on the history of land conflict and conquest in each area, as well as detailing the current situation on the ground, *Promised Land* provides startling insights into the story of land conflict in South Africa.
