You can adjust the different settings on your camera to pull the meter to zero. When you are ready to shoot in manual mode, here is one way to go through your settings. Choose the ISO that would best work for your lighting conditions. If you are in a darker space or indoors, choose a higher ISO.

As a general rule of thumb, you don't really want to let the shutter speed get below 50, unless you have an extremely steady hand. If the shutter speed gets below 50, the camera cannot take the picture fast enough to compensate for the shakiness in your hands, so the picture will be blurry.

If you are looking to do advance photography, check to make sure your camera includes manual exposure capabilities, which include full manual exposure, aperture and shutter priority, wide ISO range, and flash compensation. These advance features are a part of compact and DSLR cameras.

The higher the ISO speed the grainier your image will be. Always try use the lowest ISO speed that allows you to shoot with a shutter speed of 1\30 or faster if you are not using a tripod. Doubling the ISO speed e.g. from 100 to 200 doubles the camera's sensitivity to light (equal to one F-stop or one shutter speed).
